


State of play





Big picture: Where are we?




EU elections left the pro-climate coalition intact, but by a shakier margin





- These were not climate elections, unlike 2019. Cost-of-living crisis, competitiveness, security & geopolitical tensions were key issues
- The 'Grand Coalition' held, but has gotten narrower while the far-right continues a pattern of steady gains, now making up over a quarter of parliamentary seats
- Liberals and greens lost (-25 & -19 seats respectively) while the EPP came out the strongest
- What does it all mean? A more fragmented parliament likely to take a more transactional approach

- Competitiveness, security & defence remain driving issues in the Commission President's Political Guidelines
- But climate is firmly rooted too, framed as one of "Era's greatest challenges" and recommitment to European Green Deal is emphasised
- Future climate policy is positioned as part of the competitiveness push under the flagship upcoming Clean Industrial Deal




- <u>Continued climate action takes a front row seat</u> The European Green Deal features as a horizontal objective across all Commissioner mission letters. A 90% 2040 target to be enshrined in the Climate Law. Decarbonisation, electrification and the clean transition is emphasised in the upcoming Clean Industrial Deal.
 - → Possible concerns Strong focus on the costs of regulation rather than the benefits of continuity and clarity for investment. Amendments to ICE ban undermine predictability.
- There is an effort to respond to social pressures The energy transition is coupled with addressing the housing crisis, while competitiveness and a just transition are also paired under one portfolio.
 - → Possible concerns A broader strategy for ensuring a just transition is missing, relying on existing and underfunded tools such as the Social Climate Fund. Much focus is placed on skills rather than addressing social inequality and insecurity
- Restated emphasis on this being the 'Investment Commission' with the Budget Commissioner mandated to propose new own resources, and an EVP in charge of a new Competitiveness Fund.
 - → Possible concerns Little clarity on the scale and direction of public investment mission letters lack the urgency needed to confront Member States with the required levels of public investment, while private finance guardrails might be at risk from the deregulation push



Business' role in the new EU legislature kick-off

- EU agenda, including climate agenda, strongly driven by businesses demands, concerns, and narratives.
 - EPP = central position in all EU institutions. Businesses = one of their core constituents.
 - A lot of attention to business concerns, especially competitiveness.
 - Climate-ambitious businesses usually less loud in EU bubble.
- Current tensions can be eased with different business perspectives.



Business engagement





- Mission of the group: increase climate ambition with the shared aim of achieving a climate neutral, nature-positive, and socially inclusive European green transition.
- **New political framing**: Competitiveness, economy, finance, climate, and sustainability are intertwined.
- Narrative: Success measured in terms of reaching Green Deal objectives but framing more towards how climate and sustainability can contribute towards increased competitiveness, economic opportunities, energy and resilience
- **Businesses at the forefront**: Key players for the implementation of the Green Deal and strategic objectives as economic actors and investors.
- **Creating a business friendly environment:** Simplification and reducing reporting obligations, reducing energy costs, providing public funds.
- Continuation: 2040 climate target, post 2030 climate framework, nature, circular economy
- **Evolution:** Narrative on increased competitiveness, industry and energy security
- **Strengthen**: Demonstrate economic and competitiveness benefits of increased climate action and sustainability and role of business in delivering EU priorities
- Take stock: How can businesses deliver?





Key milestones ahead

• Week of 4 or 11 November (TBC): Hearings of Commissioners in the European Parliament.

• **5 November:** US elections.

11-22 November: COP29 in Baku.

- 1 December 11 March 2025: New European Commission takes office and first 100 days.
- 1 December: António Costa takes over the European Council Presidency.
- 1 January 2025: Poland takes over the Presidency of the Council of the EU.

EU politicians looking closely at businesses reactions and narrative.

Opportunity for businesses to engage with EU and Member-State delegations, participation and visibility.

Opportunity for businesses' engagement with Polish Government officials.





Commissioner hearings in Parliament (early November)

- Now-30 September: JURI Committee of the European Parliament to check for conflict of interests of Commissioner designates.
- October (deadlines TBC): Written questions by European Parliament committees and answers by Commissioners-designate in preparation for the hearings.
- Week of 4 or 11 November (TBC): Hearings in the European Parliament and evaluation by European Parliament group committee coordinators.
- 25-28 November (or extended): European Parliament vote on the whole College of Commissioners.

Opportunity for businesses engagement with MEPs.

Key roles: Committee Chairs, Vice-Chairs and Coordinators + Heads of national delegations.

Key groups: EPP, S&D, Renew.

Key Committees: IMCO, ENVI, ITRE,

ECON, INTA





New Commission first 100 days (~1 Dec - ~11 March)

- Clean Industrial Deal: green lead markets, governance, electrification, funding instruments...
 - 2040 Target: speed, ambition, potential reforms, post-2040 framework, potential vision for 2035 (NDC, vision for COP30).
 - Industrial transition: Industrial Decarbonisation Accelerator Act, governance for Energy Union, Circular Economy Act.
- Some social initiatives: Anti-Poverty Strategy,
 Affordable Housing Plan, EIB investment platform for housing; Youth Policy Dialogues.
- Vision for Agriculture and Food. Long-term competitiveness & sustainability of farming, fair income for farmers.
- **Pre-enlargement policy reviews** (including on climate and energy, social and economic governance).



- Shape **narratives**.
- Write/meet with relevant
 Commissioners' teams: Ribera,
 Séjourné, Jorgensen, Hoekstra,
 Sefcovic, Síkela.
- Engage with relevant DGs
 services: GROW, COMP, ENER,
 CLIMA, ENV, TRADE, INTPA.



- 2040 climate target policy proposal
- July to December: Danish Presidency
- TBC: Commission proposals on post 2030 policy climate framework



- June: Business Agenda for the next institutions on priorities of the next institutions
- Since July: Outreach and relationship building with MEPs
- Sept onwards: Positioning and advocacy on strategic priorities of the Commission (climate, industry, energy, nature, finance)
- Sept: Relaunch of the advocacy toolkit
- Sept Oct: Advocacy targeting Commissioner hearings
- Sept: Statement on Finance
- Nov: Outreach to new Commission
- Nov: Relaunch of the business and investor letter on the 2040 climate target
- 16 Dec: Green Growth Summit

- Jan: Continuation of advocacy on political files including the Clean Industrial Deal and 2040 climate target and Commission Workplan
- Week of 27 January: Event with business networks and representatives of the next institutions
